RESEARCH OUTLINE

GS Strategy Group conducted a poll October 27 – October 30, 2018 among 500 likely voters in Delaware, statewide. The poll produced a margin of error of +/- 4.38% at the 95% confidence level. Below are some key findings from that research.

KEY FINDINGS

Voters Took Notice of Carper's Ties to Big Pharma: While Senator Tom Carper is on his way to another victory in Delaware, voters have begun to notice his loyalty to big pharmaceutical companies, at the expense of his constituents.

• The top open-ended response from voters about what they are hearing about Tom Carper is that he takes campaign donations from big pharmaceutical companies. Among those voters (15% of the electorate), Carper is in a statistical dead heat with his Republican opponent, which demonstrates the negative impact that his ties to the industry has on him.

Delaware Voters Want Congress to Lower Drug Prices: 83 percent of Delaware voters believe addressing rising prescription drug prices should be a top or important priority for the next Congress.

Seture Support for Carper Could Hang on His Support For Drug Pricing Reform: Among voters who say they have voted or will vote for Carper this year, nearly 2/3 (63%) agree with the following statement: "I support Tom Carper, but he needs to do more to stand up to prescription drug corporations in order to earn my vote in the future"

The high costs of prescription drugs is a powerful issue that cuts across party lines. An overwhelming majority of voters (79%) cited prescription drug prices as a deciding factor in who they voted for. Delaware voters are 62% less likely to support a candidate who has taken contributions from prescription drug corporations and voted against policies that would reduce the price of drugs for patients (42% much less likely). Additionally, voters have an unfavorable opinion about the drug industry, regardless of their party affiliation.
